Also the following update was provided to Minister Bennett a few weeks ago on an inter-agency meeting held to inform other agencies on our handling of methamphetamine in our properties.

Methamphetamine meeting update: Last week Housing New Zealand held an inter-agency meeting about out handling of methamphetamine in our properties in response to enquiries from individual agencies which lease/ own residential properties (or in the case of Treasury's Transaction Unit, transacting residences) for whom managing a residential property portfolio is not core business.

The request was that Housing New Zealand share its experience and knowledge of methamphetamine testing and contamination. The meeting showed Housing New Zealand's key methamphetamine statistics and policy settings, including that there is no New Zealand standard for testing and decontamination but a Ministry of Health guideline which is broadly used as a defacto standard, although a Standard is under development and will be released in 2017.

The presentation also canvassed risks (including health and safety), detection methodologies, decontamination approaches, Housing New Zealand's contracting approach and stakeholder engagement and communications.

The briefing was well received with participating agencies commenting particularly on our insights into the operation of the methamphetamine testing/ decontamination sector, and the costs associated with methamphetamine management.
