Hi Will,

Your reporter earlier asked us to forward on information re: compensation to Housing New Zealand. Please see below, so far in 2015/16, the Tenancy Tribunal has awarded a total of \$963,204 in compensation to Housing New Zealand for damage caused by tenants. This is for all types of damage, not just meth, but we can confirm the majority of this amount does relate to methamphetamine.

- \$34,176.76 - Ashburton
- \$29,459.84 - Gisborne
- \$29,446.70 - Whangarei
- \$25,785.45 - Palmerston North
- \$24,186.59 - Auckland Central.

Just regarding the property in Western Springs - we eventually gained possession of this property in late December. It went through decontamination in January. Results back from the decontamination showed that not all areas of the property were clean of meth, so it had to be decontaminated a second time. We have recently received the results back and the house is clean. It is now going through our 'void' programme. This is where we return the home to a lettable standard. Any outstanding maintenance work is undertaken, any tenant damage is repaired and new curtains, carpets will be installed. It takes us around 4 weeks to get all of these jobs done and it will then be available for a new tenant.

The topics I'd like to cover are:

-The time and resources going into fixing P-contaminated houses -The impact of having houses out of circulation on being able to house people in need -Whether there's scope to raise the threshold of P-contamination before a decontamination is triggered -How long on average it takes from identifying a house is contaminated to getting it ready again for tenants (on that note, and as something of a case study, we've swung past a state house at 708 Great North Road, Western Springs and seen its boarded up. The neighbours say its P-contaminated and has been vacant since January. Could you elaborate on the plans for that house and why it's still boarded up five months on and counting?) -How much money has been recovered from tenants found to have caused P damage.

Shooting at a P cleanup next week would be cool, if we can proceed with that I'd be most appreciative.
